

## JOHN THE BAPTIST

Since June 24 falls on a Sunday this year, the Church has the opportunity for a more intense celebration of the birth of John the Baptist, who is often described as the last of the Old Testament prophets and the bridge between Judaism and Christianity. More commonly, John is known as the “precursor” of our Lord Jesus Christ. All the Gospels report John’s basic message: Repent, the kingdom is near at hand. One greater than I is coming.

Though he was a wandering preacher who dressed in camel skins and ate grasshoppers, John’s legacy is one of true royalty. His origins are similar to those foretold by God through the prophet Isaiah: “You are my servant, he said to me, Israel through whom I show my glory” (Isaiah 49:3). John’s humility—“I am not he”—was surpassed only by that of his Lord Jesus, the humble servant who followed.

### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

It's midsummer day! We have the advantage of celebrating one of the great hidden treasures of our liturgical calendar on a Sunday this year. There are only three "nativity" feasts on our calendar: for the Lord, the Blessed Mother (September 8), and today's birth of the Baptist. Today's date is anchored by the Annunciation (March 25), when Mary learns not only of her own child's advent, but of Elizabeth's child. We are exactly half a year away from Christmas Eve. There are strong traditions around this feast. Just as the winter solstice provides a rich vocabulary for Christmas, so does the abundance of light at midsummer inform this celebration. Just as at Christmas, a religious festival spills over into culture. As summer light reaches its peak, the sun-drenched zones of northern Europe see people staying up all night, lighting "St. John's fires" in the long summer twilight. Bonfires seem to be the unifying force in all these celebrations, kindled along the shores of the St. Lawrence in Quebec and Montreal, with harbor illuminations in France. You may be most interested in the custom in San Juan, Puerto Rico, the Baptist's own city. People there will leap into the sea between midnight and dawn to honor John. Why not find your way to a pool, a lake, or a sandy beach today and plunge in to recall your baptism? It's a tradition!



Był to wspaniały czas modlitwy, medytacji, konferencji pastoralnych i wypoczynku. Ten czas pozwolił mi nie co zwolnić tempo codziennego życia, które szczególnie w naszej parafii jest wyjątkowo intensywne. W tym bardzo pozytywnym czasie sporo czasu poświęciłem na modlitwę w intencji naszych parafian i tych, którzy modlą się w naszym kościele.

**SMACZNE JEDZENIE, PIWO, MUZYKA,

**Imię Jan jest pochodzenia hebrajskiego i oznacza tyle, co "Bóg jest łaskawy". Jan Chrzciciel urodził się jako syn kapłana Zachariasza i Elżbiety.** Poprzez swoją matkę, Elżbietę, Jan był krewnym Jezusa. Jan pędził żywot pustelnika, sam lub w towarzystwie innych. Jako herold Mesjasza Jan podkreślał z naciskiem, że nie wystarczy przynależność do potomstwa Abrahama, ale trzeba czynić owoce pokuty, trzeba wewnętrznego przeobrażenia. Na znak skruchy i gotowości zmiany życia udzielał chrztu pokuty. Zaczęto nawet go pytać, czy przypadkiem on sam nie jest zapowiadany Mesjaszem. Jan stanowczo rozwiewał wątpliwości twierdząc, że "Ten, który idzie za mną, mocniejszy jest ode mnie: ja nie jestem godzien nosić Mu sandałów". Na prośbę Chrystusa, który przybył nad Jordan, Jan udzielił Mu chrztu. Potem niejeden raz widział Chrystusa nad Jordanem i świadczył o Nim wobec tłumu: "Oto Baranek Boży, który gładzi grzechy świata". Na skutek tego wyznania, przy Chrystusie Panu zjawili się dwaj pierwsi uczniowie - Jan i Andrzej, którzy dotąd byli uczniami św. Jana. Osobą Jana zainteresował się władca Galilei, Herod II Antypas (+ 40), syn Heroda I Wielkiego, który nakazał wymordować dzieci w Betlejem. Można się domyślać, że Herod wezwał Jana do swojego zamku, Macherontu. Gorzko jednak pożałował swojej ciekawości. Jan bowiem skorzystał z tej okazji, aby rzucić mu prosto w oczy: "Nie wolno ci mieć żony twoego brata". Rozgniewany król, z poduszczeniu żony brata Filipa, którą ku ogólnemu oburzeniu Herod wziął za własną, oddalając swoją żonę prawowitą, nakazał Jana aresztować. W dniu swoich urodzin wydał ucztę, w czasie której, pijany, pod przysięgą zobowiązał się dać córce Herodiady, Salome, wszystko, o cokolwiek zażąda. Ta po naradzeniu się z matką zażądała głowy Jana. Herod nakazał katowi wykonać wyrok śmierci na Janie i jego głowę przynieść na misie dla Salome. Jan miał wtedy trzydzieści kilka lat. Jezus wystawił Janowi świadectwo, jakiego żaden człowiek z Jego ust nie otrzymał: "Coście wyszli oglądać na pustyni? (...) Proroka zobaczyć? Tak, powiadam wam, nawet więcej niż proroka. On jest tym, o którym napisano: *Oto ja posyłam mego wysłańca przed Tobą, aby Ci przygotował drogę*. Zaprawdę powiadam wam: Między narodzonymi z niewiast nie powstał większy od Jana Chrzciciela". Jan Chrzciciel jako jedyny wśród świętych Państwowych cieszy się takim przywilejem, iż obchodzi się jako uroczystość dzień jego narodzin. U wszystkich innych świętych obchodzimy jako święto dzień ich śmierci - czyli dzień ich narodzin dla nieba. Ponadto w kalendarzu liturgicznym znajduje się także wspomnienie męczeńskiej śmierci św. Jana Chrzciciela, obchodzone 29 sierpnia. W Janie Chrzcicielu uderza jego świętość, życie pełne asczy i pokuty i siła charakteru, bezkompromisowość. Był pierwszym świętym czczonym w całym Kościele.
