TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

November is a month of remembrance for the dead, and cemeteries have long been a focus for prayer. Our tradition holds great respect for bodily remains, since the body was created and redeemed by God, was once the "dwelling place of the Holy Spirit," and has a destiny of life with God in glory. The funeral practices of the early church contrasted greatly with those of the pagans, who had a great dread of the dead body. The ancient Christian funeral liturgy ended with the relatives and friends giving a final kiss to the body. It expressed affection and showed their faith that the grave would not be the last word. This kiss horrified pagans, who thought that any contact with the dead was degrading.

Every year on their loved one's "birthday to life," the Christians would return to the place of their burial to mark their profound communion with those whose lives were hidden in Christ. Typically, they buried the dead with their faces turned toward the east, symbolizing the rising of the Sun of Justice, Christ, at the end of days. They were attracted to the catacombs or burial grounds just as we are today. They would often celebrate the Eucharist at the tomb. Before long, as soon as Christians were allowed to build places for worship, they relocated cemeteries from beyond the city walls to surround the church. This was not so much because the church made the ground holy, but because the bodies of the saints hallowed the ground on which the church was built, a subtle but beautiful difference. —Rev. Did you know?...

That 2 years ago around December SATG School received a 6 million dollar/over 5 years grant awarded through the Archdiocese of Chicago, and funded through CME . From that day on there has been tremendous changes at SATG School. Our teachers have been able to apply an innovative a new learning environment for our students. Not only in the classroom but also in their own teaching. Students can challenge

themselves and be able to see their own growth. Personalized Learning is student centered. This “learner centered approach” provides students with, “opportunities that reflect an understanding of each individual’s needs, strengths, interests.”, according to the LEAP Framework. It is also, “learner led, empowering learners to take ownership of their learning, adjusting dynamically to their skills, curiosity and goals.” Students reflect upon what the data tells them, and take into consideration their work habits. They are then able to spend some 1:1 time with their teachers who conference with them on setting academic goals, and how to achieve them.

Another thing that has change is our technology. Students have access to chrome books, SMART Boards, and iPads. St. Albert the Great continues to evolve to provide students with a 21st Century education.

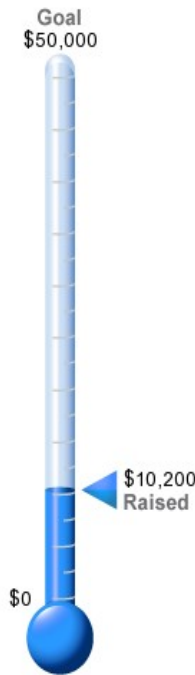

Dziękujemy Ci za przyjaciół i pamiętamy o tych, którzy nie mają przyjaciół.

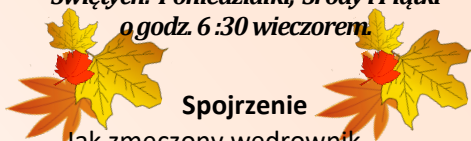
Dziękujemy Ci za wolność i niepodległość oraz pamiętamy o tych, którzy nie zaznali wolności.

W Ewangeliach obraz ten rozumiany jako symbol ostatniej godziny świata. Choć powtórne przyjście Pana dokona się w czasie dla nas nieznanym, to w słowach Pana Jezusa odnajdujemy zachętę, aby uczyć się rozpoznawania znaków, które mogą je zapowiadać. Wsluchując się w naukę Chrystusa, Kościół od samego początku naucza o nieuchronności przyjścia Pana i sądu nad światem. Zwykle boimy się wszelkich kontroli i rozliczeń. Wystarczy przypomnieć, ile nerwów kosztowały nas zdawane w szkole egzaminy albo trudne rozmowy z szefem na temat realizacji naszych zadań służbowych. A co dopiero, kiedy pomyślimy o tym najważniejszym i najpoważniejszym sądzie Bożym! Święty Tomasz z Akwinu tłumaczył, że człowiek jest zarówno indywidualną osobą, jak i częścią całego rodzaju ludzkiego. Stąd powinien odbyć się nad nim dwójaki sąd. Pierwszy, osobisty, kiedy zostanie skonfrontowany ze swoim życiem oraz dobrymi i złymi uczynkami. Drugi sąd nad człowiekiem jako częścią całej wspólnoty ludzkiej. On będzie dopełnieniem historii zbawienia.

Słowo Boże nie bagatelizuje prawdy wiary o sądzie Bożym. Wsluchujmy się w nie, mając wzrok utkwiony w obrazie miłosiernego Ojca. Tego, który z miłości stworzył świat i z miłości go odkupił przez krew Jezusa przelaną za nas na krzyżu.
