IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that "I am the LORD," and that "there is none besides me" (Isaiah 45:6). Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion—that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.

SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES (1560-1646) AND JOHN DE BRÉBEUF (1593-1649) AND THEIR COMPANIONS

Their mission was to New France, but these missionaries found in present-day New York State and the province of Ontario a world wildly different from the homes they left behind. Six Jesuit priests, Fathers Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noël Chabanel—and Jesuit lay volunteers René Goupil and John LaLande—shared the gospel with the Native Americans they met, in languages they painstakingly learned, and through images they creatively adapted to the indigenous cultures (for example, John de Brébeuf’s “’Twas in the Moon of Wintertime: the Huron Carol”). But their evangelization was caught up in turmoil beyond their control: a smallpox epidemic, battles between French and English trading interests—the traders united only by their willingness to exploit the Native Americans—and conflict among the tribes themselves, Huron, Mohawk, Iroquois. The missionaries’ perseverance despite exhausting hardships, their steadfast courage in facing unspeakable tortures, and undaunted love even for those who martyred them, bore fruit, immediately in Kateri Tekakwitha’s sanctity, eventually in the Catholicism that still flourishes in the United States and Canada.

What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: “Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one’s] heart more specifically: do this, shun that” (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn’t just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) **Study Sacred Scripture** and the **teaching** of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts** and **background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- 4) Regularly partake in an **examination of conscience** to hear God’s voice in your life.¹

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. “Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling” about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.”²

Here are some questions for further reflection:

1. When has my conscience guided me to “do good and avoid evil”?
2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
3. Forming conscience is a “lifelong task.” What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?

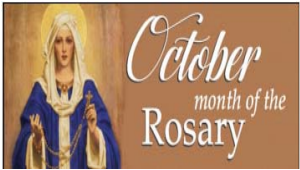

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście!

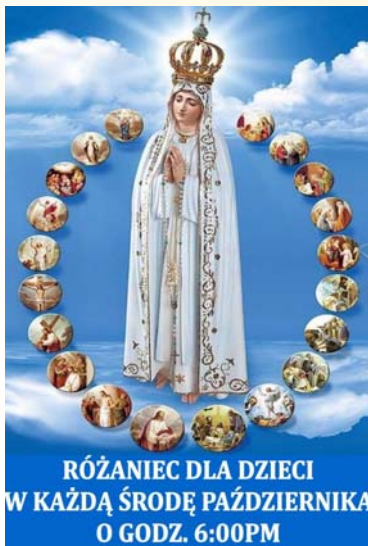
Od kilku tygodni kontynuujemy w naszej parafii program „**Renew My Church-Odnów Mój Kościół**”. Wraz z naszym parafialnym „**TEAM**” spotykamy się przez internet z przedstawicielami Diecezji Chicago i z przedstawicielami sąsiednich parafii (**St. Fabian, St. Gerald, St. Louis de Montfort**). Wspólnie przez „**modlitwę i dyskusję w prawdzie oraz ufności**” szukamy jak najlepszego duchowego oraz materialnego rozwiązania dla naszych wspólnot parafialnych. W najbliższej przyszłości podam więcej szczegółowych informacji na ten temat. Zachęcam wszystkich parafian i gości do żarliwej modlitwy słowami **św. Franciszka z Asyżu**:

„Panie Jezu, przemawiasz dziś do nas tak, jak przemawiałeś do tych świętych mężczyzn i kobiet, którzy szli przed nami. Jak czyniłeś to przez wszystkie wieki, także i dziś wzywasz nas, mówiąc: Odnów mój Kościół. Wylej na nas dar Twojego Ducha Świętego, abyśmy potrafili: wyraźnie Cię usłyszeć, z uwagą słuchać jedni drugich, śmiało marzyć o przyszłości, mądrze rozeznawać Twoje wskazania odważnie trwać w pełnieniu Twojej świętej woli, łączyć się w dobroczynności, bez wahania rezygnować ze swoich planów, aby przyjmować większe dobro i przekazywać Twoje dary przyszłym pokoleniom. Trwajmy w świętym gronie Najświętszej Maryi Dziewicy, apostołów i wszystkich świętych. Niech ich przykład i obecność natchną nas cierpliwą ufnością w działanie Twojej łaski. Prosimy o to Ciebie, który żyjesz i królujesz z Ojcem w jedności Ducha Świętego, jeden Bóg przez wszystkie wieki wieków. Amen”.

- za wszystkich uczestników programu „**Odnów Mój Kościół**”, aby wyraźnie usłyszeli Pana, z uwagą słuchali jedni drugich i śmiało marzyli o przyszłości.
- za wszystkich liderów parafialnych, aby otworzyli się na przyjęcie większego dobra i zaangażowali się w odnowę Kościoła dla przyszłych pokoleń.
- za wszystkich wiernych, aby pamiętali o swoim zobowiązaniu chrzcielnym i byciu posłanym do niesienia Dobrej Nowiny naszym wspólnotom.
- za nas samych, za naszych braci i siostry, aby Pan posłał swego Ducha Świętego, by odnowił każdego z nas i dał nam odwagę i siłę do pójścia za Nim, gdziekolwiek nas poprowadzi.

Zachęcam także wszystkich do pobrania u naszych marszałków specjalnych kopertek na tzw. „Wypominki Listopadowe”. Przez cały miesiąc listopad będziemy się modlić za tych, którzy odeszli od nas ze znakiem wiary i śpią w pokoju.

ODDAĆ CAŁY ŚWIAT BOGU

Obchodzimy dziś 91 Światowy Dzień Misyjny, modląc się za misjonarzy i wspierając ich dzieła ofiarami. Święty Paweł uczy, że głoszenie Ewangelii nie dokonuje się wyłącznie słowem. To Duch Święty udziela przekonującej mocy słowom i otwiera serca na przyjęcie prawdy. Modlimy się, prosząc o Boże błogosławieństwo i łaskę dla misjonarzy, by byli podatni na natchnienia Pana i wiernie wypełniali swą misję. Słowo Boże uczy, że nic się nie dzieje bez woli Stwórcy. Pierwsza trudność w przyjęciu prawdy o wszechmocy Boga obecnego w naszych dziejach polega na tym, że On przeprowadza swe zbawcze plany, posługując się ludźmi „nieodpowiednimi” do powierzonych im zadań. Król perski Cyrus był poganinem, ale to właśnie jego wybrał Pan i powierzył mu specjalną misję. Druga trudność polega na tym, że wydaje się, że Bóg jest nieobecny. Dostrzegamy w świecie jedynie bezpośrednie przyczyny i skutki naszych działań. Nie widzimy ukrytych śladów ingerencji Stwórcy.
