What Is the Mass?

What is the Mass? There is no simple answer to that question. The Church uses many different images and terms to describe our most important prayer. The Mass is the celebration of the Eucharist, a Greek word that means "thanksgiving." It is the Lord's Supper. It is the Breaking of the Bread. It is the memorial of the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. It is the Holy Sacrifice, in which the sacrifice of Christ on the cross is perpetuated. It is the holy and divine liturgy, the sacred mysteries. It is the source and summit of our Christian lives, the new covenant, the work of the Holy Spirit, the paschal mystery. The many different words and images that we use when we speak of the Mass are not signs of confusion, but of wonder at what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1328) calls the "inexhaustible richness" of the Eucharist. The Mass, our greatest prayer and our deepest mystery, is celebrated every day, many times a day, the world over. The Eucharist is both "bread from heaven" and "daily bread." From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

“A short life and the time of Advent are sufficient enough for living well and honestly”. (Cicero)

We are already approaching Advent, which is a time of waiting for the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ in the mystery of Christmas. We also remember that the First Sunday of Advent begins a new liturgical year in the Catholic Church. May this time that is ahead of us be filled with joy, peace and true transformation of our hearts, minds and everyday life. For these special gifts let us pray the words of this Advent prayer:

Heavenly Father, your son, Jesus, is your greatest gift to us, a great sign of your love. Guide us as we strive to walk in that love together as a family this Advent. As we prepare our hearts for Christmas, bring us closer to each other and to your son. Give us the grace and strength we need every day.

*Help us to always trust in you. Come, Lord Jesus, lead all people closer to you.
Come and dispel the darkness of our world with the light of your love. Amen.*

When Jesus does not speak in eloquent sentences, but barks out imperative statements such as in our Gospel reading today, one can understand the urgency. There is no place for flowery language. “Be watchful! Be alert!” One has a sense that these should be written in bold or all caps! He tells the parable of the homeowner leaving his workers at home, with no knowledge of when he would return. Without phones and texts and travel schedules it could have meant the homeowner was returning sometime in the day, or sometime in the coming month or year. So Jesus is not telling us, “You have to behave for a little bit,” but rather, “You must live your life and work like the homeowner is always here. You must always be prepared.”

WATCH!

This author was very aware of the language of “master/servant” in the Gospel today and is reading it and praying it in light of discussions on racism in recent months. Perhaps this goes with the last imperative at the end of the parable to “Watch!” This year has taught us to be alert in our actions such

as social distancing, masks, and sanitizing, as well as in our language and even our thoughts. Now how do we apply that to our spirituality, to our faith? For many, due to restrictions on numbers in church, singing, and choirs, this has meant learning to pray in a whole different way. The celebration of liturgy is the same as ever, with its focus always on the Word and the Eucharist, but for those in the pew, or still watching on livestream, the sense of active participation has taken on a very different meaning from how most of us have experienced liturgy in our lifetime. It feels like we have become spectators rather than participants. Perhaps this challenge can move us from complacency in our faith, to rediscover and relate to God in new ways, and call us to be even stronger in our personal faith. We must remain diligent. We must “watch.” We must hope. We must love. We must pray.

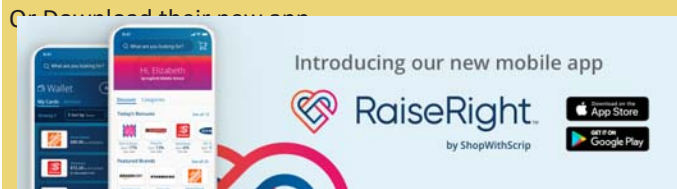

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście!

„Krótki okres Życia i Adwentu jest ostatecznie długi na to, aby żyć dobrze i uczciwie”. (Cyceron)

Tak, tak to już Adwent, czyli czas radosnego oczekiwania na przyjście Pana Jezusa w tajemnicy Bożego Narodzenia. Ponadto pamiętajmy, że pierwsza Niedziela Adwentu rozpoczyna nowy rok liturgiczny w Kościele Katolickim. Niech ten czas, który przed nami będzie wypełniony radością, pokojem i prawdziwą przemianą naszych serc, umysłów i codziennego życia. O te Boże dary módlmy się słowami adwentowej modlitwy:



**„Jezu Chryste, który jesteś Drogą, Prawdą i Życiem.
Wołam do Ciebie: Jezu, Synu Boga Najwyższego.
Ciebie anioł Gabriel zwiastował Maryi Dziewicy:
Przybądź i króluj na wieki nad swoim ludem!**

**Jezu, Ty jesteś Świętym Boga.
Twoją obecnością rozradował się Jan Chrzciciel w łonie Elżbiety,
Daj całemu światu radość zbawienia!**

**Jezu Zbawicielu.
Anioł objawił Twoje imię Józefowi, mężowi sprawiedliwemu;
Przybądź i króluj na wieki nad swoim ludem!**

**Jezu, Światłości świata.
Ciebie oczekiwał Symeon i wszyscy sprawiedliwi:
Przybądź i króluj na wieki nad swoim ludem.**

Ciebie zapowiedział Zachariasz jako przychodzącego z wysoka:
Przybądź i oświeć tych, którzy trwają w ciemnościach grzechu i uzdrów ich”. Amen.**

CZAS NAGLI

Bezcenny dar czasu, to dar darmo dany – łaska. Ona jednak – jak każda inna – domaga się naszego wysiłku współpracy; by czas adwentu ani czas naszego życia nie „przebiegał nam przez palce”. Byśmy podejmowali trud, aby dzień po dniu wypełniać szukaniem Bożej, a nie swojej chwały. Dziś rozpoczynamy adwent – czas radosnego oczekiwania na przyjście Zbawiciela. Oczekujemy nie tylko na liturgiczne obchody tego, co już się dokonało w Betlejem; ale też i na to, co niezawodnie przyniesie przyszłość: dzień paruzji. Będzie to radosny koniec czasu i powrót Króla do swoich poddanych. Powrót, który dokona się w pełni splendoru, co wyznajemy w liturgii, mówiąc: „oczekujemy Twego przyjścia w chwale”. Prorok Izajasz przypomina Imiona Boga: nasz Odkupiciel, Ojciec, Twórca. Odślania obraz Boga, który w swoim miłosierdziu, mimo naszej niewierności, pozostaje wierny zawartemu z nami Przymierzu. Jego darem jest przyjście Jezusa Chrystusa – i to pierwsze, i to, którego jeszcze oczekujemy. Pan Jezus wzywa nas do czujności serca – do odpowiedzi miłością na Miłość. Znakiem naszej miłości jest staranność w wypełnianiu powierzonych zadań, które sprowadzają się do jednego: miłować Boga i bliźniego, i siebie samego. Miłować i służyć roztropnie. „Pod koniec życia będziemy sądeni z miłości” – uczył św. Jan od Krzyża – adwentowy święty. Pan Jezus do współczesnej mistyczki mówi: „Czas nagli. Spójrz, ile go minęło w twoim życiu bezpowrotnie... i bezowocnie, choć tyle było krzątania twojej wokół ciebie samej, wśród innych” (A. Lenczewska, Słowa pouczenia, nr 293). Spójrz... *Anastazja Seul*

ROZWAŻANIE: Czuwanie jest elementem ludzkiej egzystencji. Matka czuwa nad dzieckiem, nad życiem. Młody człowiek czuwa, by nie przegapić miłości. W chorobie czuujemy przy bliskim, by nie zawieść miłości. Zatem naturalne wydaje się, że również w naszej przestrzeni duchowej musi istnieć jakieś duchowe czuwanie. To czuwanie Paweł trafnie zdefiniował w Pierwszym Liście do Koryntian (1 Kor 7, 29-31). Nie chodzi o to, że nie powinniśmy zakładać rodzin, ale o to, żeby wiedzieć, do czego to życie rodzinne zmierza. Nie chodzi o to, żebyśmy nie pragnęli ludzkiej miłości, ale wiedzieli, jaki jest jej Boży ideał. Nie chodzi o to, żebyśmy nie nabywali dóbr materialnych, ale o to, żeby były one środkiem do celu, a nie zastępowały go. W chrześcijańskim czuwaniu chodzi m.in. o to, żeby nie mylić środków z celami. O to, by odzwierny nie chciał zarządzać własnością Pana jak swoją – bo wtedy może się okazać, że właściciel nadejdzie zbyt szybko. *Rozważanie zaczerpnięte z terminarzyka Dzień po dniu 2017*
