## The Penitential Rite

Standing together in the presence of the Lord, we acknowledge our weakness, our sins and faults and failings. But the penitential rite is really less about our sins than it is about God's mercy. It is not a time for individual confession, like a mini-sacrament of reconciliation. It is, rather, a preparatory rite, preparing us to praise the mercy of Christ as we acknowledge our own weakness. When Simon Peter witnesses the miraculous catch of fish—when he realizes who is in the boat with him—he falls at Jesus' feet with the words, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man" (Luke 5:8). We are like Peter. The more aware of the Lord's presence we become, the more awareness we also have of our sinfulness, our weakness.

The penitential rite of the Mass takes several forms, from the traditional *Confiteor* or "I confess" to a litany, spoken or sung by the deacon or cantor with responses by the entire assembly. The penitential rite always includes the words *Kyrie, eleison; Christe, eleison*—Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy. This ancient Greek prayer came to the Roman liturgy from the East, and still echoes in many of the litanies of the Eastern Rite Churches. These words turn our gaze from our own weakness to the gentleness, the kindness, the forgiving love of Christ.

**"Jesus, I Trust in You"!**

Mark describes the beginning of Jesus' ministry with his proclamation that the "kingdom of God is at hand." The rest of Mark's Gospel—all of Jesus' preaching and healing, his death and resurrection—describes the inauguration of this kingdom of God. For Mark, the life of Jesus is the center point of history, where everything leads up to Jesus, and everything follows from Jesus. Mark then tells us that the first disciples follow Jesus immediately and wholeheartedly. They leave their work and family, all for Jesus. Because compared to Jesus and the life he offers, everything else is secondary.

Perhaps our invitations from God do not entail such dramatic life changes. But all who follow Jesus are called to align our life and values with his ways of love. As we continue to mature in love and in faith, we might ask: What needs to be renewed, re-oriented, or discarded in light of our life in Christ?

### JONAH AND NINEVEH

Jonah makes a rare appearance this week. The book of Jonah is a fascinating tale of God, stubborn Jonah, surprising Nineveh,

and the famous fish (or whale). Please consider reading the whole book, just 48 verses, together with a good commentary. The book is read at Jewish services at Yom Kippur, as a profound reflection about God and about all of us.

Today's passage takes place shortly after Jonah's time in the fish's belly. Jonah finally performs the task that God asks of him, to call the people of Nineveh to repentance. (Nineveh was notorious for its brutality.) Their sudden repentance is bitterly accepted by Jonah, as he resents God's mercy for Nineveh. God reminds Jonah that the people of Nineveh are God's beloved too. Like the parable of the Prodigal Son, the story hints at the vastness of God's mercy, especially forgiveness of those who seem least deserving. We are reminded that all of us are sinners, and we are all in need of God's mercy.

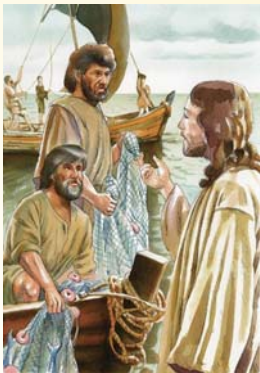

#### Czas

**Wszystkie dzisiejsze czytania są o czasie, to słowo występuje tu bardzo często. Czym właściwie jest czas? Paganie traktowali**

**czas w sposób cykliczny: wszystko krąży, powtarza się w pewnym rytmie przyrody: wiosna-lato-jesień-zima itd. Na podstawie tego rytmu stworzono pogańskie obrzędy, które tak samo rytmicznie w kółko się powtarzały.**



Zupełnie inne jest biblijne podejście do czasu: to pędząca strzała, ma swój początek (zob. Księga Rodzaju) ale ma też swój cel, do którego zmierza (zob. Apokalipsa). Na tej linii między początkiem a końcem jesteśmy my, na tej linii działa też Bóg, aby nas zbawić,

czyli zjednoczyć z sobą. Nasze życie na ziemi jest właśnie takim czasem Boga – kairos – czasem wypełnionym Jego zbawczym działaniem. Tak więc czas to nie są leniwie i bez znaczenia płynące dni, przeciwnie, nie wolno go marnować, pozwolić choć jednej chwili, by „przebiegła przez palce”, bo w niej obecny jest Bóg, który działa i daje konkretne łaski, byśmy z nich korzystali. Jak groźnie brzmią dzisiaj słowa Pawła, że ten właśnie nasz czas na ziemi, czas zbawiania nas przez Boga tutaj jest krótki! Dlatego w tym działaniu Boga jest jakiś pośpiech, nacisk (jak na proroka Jonasza), wyznaczanie konkretnych terminów, tzw. deadlines („masz czterdzieści dni i koniec”), wprowadzenie pewnego rodzaju napięcia i poczucia odpowiedzialności, bo przecież „czas się wypełnił” i właśnie teraz „bliskie jest królestwo Boże”. Dlatego też niektóre rzeczy mają być zrobione teraz, a nie jutro! Nie będzie drugiej szansy życia na ziemi. Czas jest krótki.

#### Święty Franciszek Salezy, biskup i doktor Kościoła.

W IV i XVI w. pojawiło się najwięcej doktorów Kościoła w całej historii. Wynikało to z problemów, z jakimi musiało się zmagać wówczas chrześcijaństwo. W czasie burzliwej reformacji żył biskup, który świętość rozumiał jako łagodność, dobroć, przyjaźń i mądrość. Ten chrześcijański humanista to św. Franciszek Salezy.

Urodził się 21 sierpnia 1567 r. w Sabaudii. Była to kraina zachowująca pewną niezależność wobec sąsiadujących królestw. Prosty lud sabaudzki, nie znając się na zawiłościach teologicznych, raczej chodził na nabożeństwa do zborów, niż faktycznie przechodził na kalwinizm. Ten uroczy zakątek u podnóża Alp potrzebował apostoła, który sprowadziłby wszystkich wierzących na drogę prawdy. Do tego zadania Bóg powołał arystokratę z urodzenia i kaznodzieję z powołania – św. Franciszka Salezego.

#### Pasterz dusz.

Ojciec Franciszka pragnął przekazać mu swoje dziedzictwo i zapewnić wykształcenie. Posłał więc syna do Paryża i Padwy na studia prawnicze. Franciszek ukończył je z wyróżnieniem jako doktor obojga praw. Jednak wbrew woli ojca, zanim został mu przekazany cały majątek rodowy, Franciszek w 1593 r. przyjął święcenia. Biskup mianował go proboszczem katedry w Annecy, w której znalazł schronienie po wygnaniu z Genewy. Młody duszpasterz od razu odnalazł swój charyzmat, który wyrażają słowa św. Pawła: z wszelką mądrością nauczajcie i napominajcie samych siebie (Kol 3,16). Kazania św. Franciszka przyciągały tłumy wiernych nie tylko z Annecy czy Sabaudii. Było to bowiem nauczanie płynące z serca, a więc pełne miłości, która ma największą moc przekonywania (Flp 2,1). W misji duszpasterskiej św. Franciszek zwracał uwagę także na to, czego wyrzekli się kalwini – trwałą i rzeczywistą obecność Jezusa w Najświętszym Sakramencie. Z misyjną posługą udał się m.in. do Paryża i Rzymu. W Świętym Mieście został mianowany biskupem pomocniczym Sabaudii. Kilka lat później został biskupem Genewy (1602 r.).
