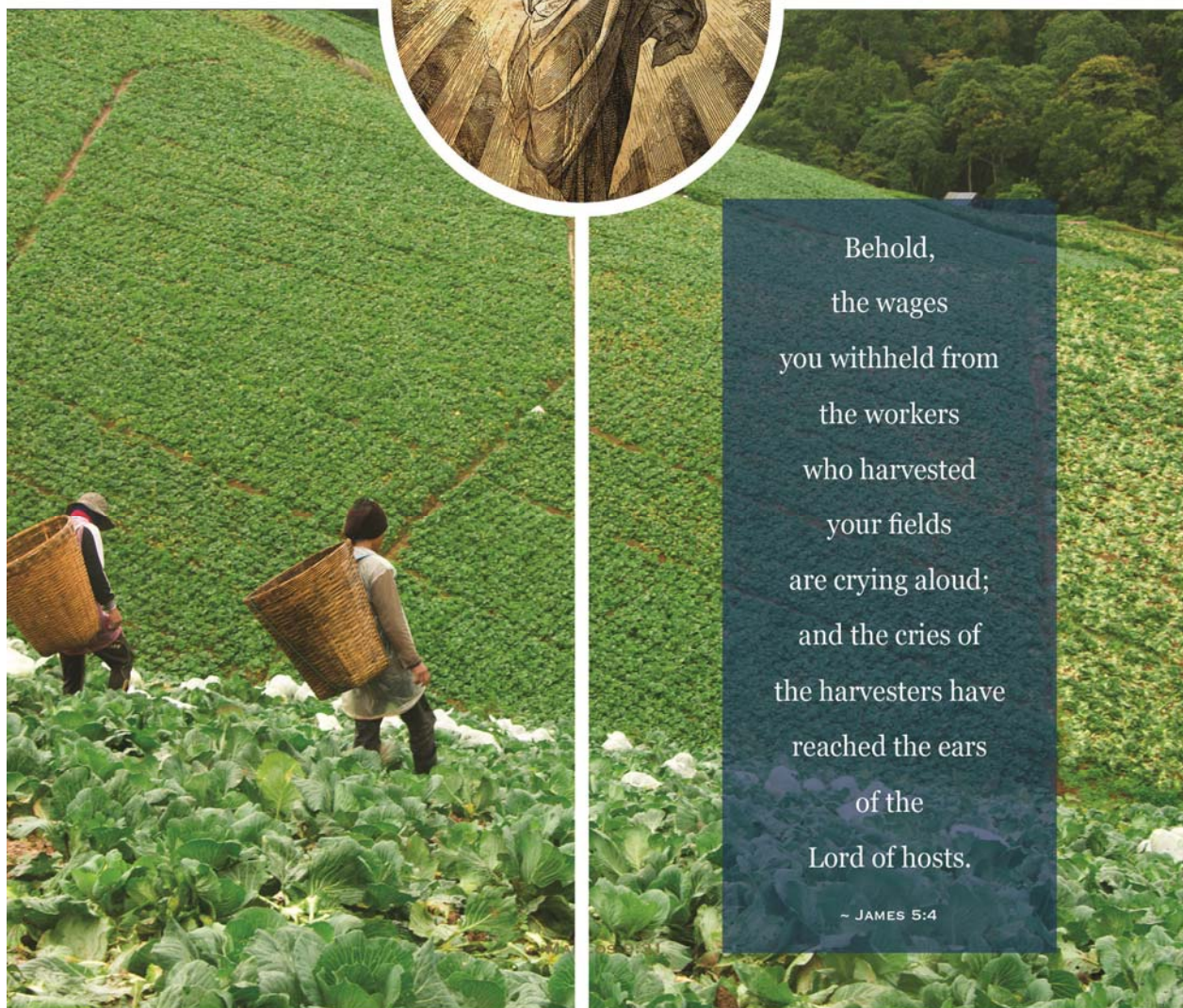

FEAST OF FAITH The Lord's Prayer

The Eucharistic Prayer ends with the great "Amen," the acclamation of assent by the assembly. Then the Communion rite begins with the Lord's Prayer. We pray this prayer in many contexts, both inside and outside the Church's liturgy. Here, in the context of the Mass, the Lord's Prayer is profoundly eucharistic. When we ask for our "daily bread," we are asking for the gift of the Eucharist. When we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others, we are seeking forgiveness



and purity of heart before we approach the altar to receive the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood—"so that what is holy may, in fact, be given to those who are holy" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 81). At Mass, a prayer for peace is inserted between the prayer and the doxology. In this prayer, called the embolism, the Church asks God for freedom—freedom from sin and all anxiety and distress. We are living in an in-between time; even as we rejoice in Christ's presence, we await his coming in joyful hope. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Behind us already several weeks of the catechetical school year **2021/2022**. I am happy that so many children gladly attend schools affiliated with our parish. This is a very good reason to be happy! Just a few years ago our biggest problem was a low attendance. We have plans for the next school year to create double grade classes in the St. Albert the Great Catholic School. Today, however, we are facing a problem with shortage of teachers and classrooms.

Here is the students attendance for the **2021/2022** school year:

- **St. Albert the Great Catholic School** – 225 students;
- **Fr. Ignacy Posadzy Polish School** – 520 students;
- **CCD Religious Education Program** – 193 students;
- **Adam Mickiewicz Polish School** – 315 students;
- **SPRED** – 5 students.



In total we have 1258 students attending our schools. This is a good reason for pride and concern for our next generation, the future of our parish and our church.

I thank **71** parishioners who already made donations (**\$25,317.00**) toward the canopy over the main entrance door to our church.

Let us bring up to Jesus our plans and hopes, through the intercession of Holy Mary, Mother of God and St. Albert the Great - pray for us!

St. Teresa of Jesus was born on March 28, 1515, in Avila, Spain. Her mother died when she was 14, and she entered the Carmelite Monastery in Avila in 1535. In 1554 that she experienced the conversion that would mark the rest of her life. Coming upon a statue of the wounded Christ, Teresa was suddenly and intensely moved by what Christ had suffered for her and was overwhelmed by her own lack of gratitude for His sufferings. Teresa's conversion, which actually occurred over a period of four years, set her on a new pathway that led her to an intimate experience of God, a God she came to perceive as a beloved Friend. In prayer, God poured out His love on His daughter, who had become a willing and open vessel as she surrendered totally to her Lord and King. Convinced that God wanted it, she set about reforming the Carmelite order, establishing convents throughout Spain where religious would live according to the original spirit of Carmel. Fortunately for us, Teresa's superiors ordered her to document the remarkable events of her life and her original works still exist today. The Book of Her Life, The Way of Perfection, The Interior Castle, and The Foundations are her main works, detailing her remarkable pathway to God. It is through these profoundly human yet mystical writings that we experience Teresa's spirit that inspires us to enter into an ever deeper relationship with God. Teresa died in 1582 at the age of 67. In 1622 she was canonized, and in 1970 Pope Paul VI declared her a Doctor of the Church, the first woman ever to be so recognized.

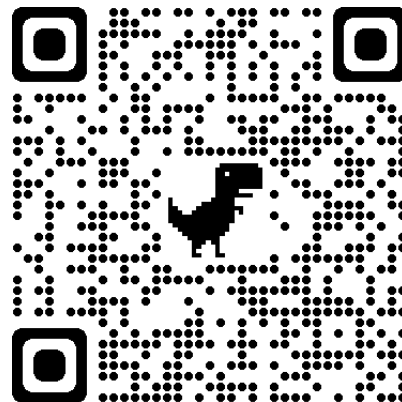

Z biurka Ks. Proboszcza

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście !

Za nami kilka tygodni nowego roku szkolnego i katechetycznego 2021/2022. Cieszę się bardzo z ogromnej ilości dzieci oraz młodzieży, którzy uczęszczają tak chętnie do naszych szkół działających przy naszym kościele. A jest się z czego cieszyć! Jeszcze kilka lat temu największym problemem była niewystarczająca ilość dzieci i młodzieży. Za rok planujemy otworzyć podwójne oddziały klas w Katolickiej Szkole św. Alberta Wielkiego. Dziś niestety problemem jest brak nauczycieli oraz brak pomieszczeń na kolejne klasy.

A tak wygląda ilość uczniów w poszczególnych szkołach:

- **Szkoła Katolicka św. Alberta Wielkiego – 225 uczniów;**
- **Polska Katolicka Szkoła Parafialna im. ks. Ignacego Posadzego – 520 uczniów;**
- **CCD program religijny – 193 uczniów;**
- **Polska Szkoła im. Adama Mickiewicza – 315 uczniów;**
- **SPRED – 5 uczniów.**

Razem wszystkich uczniów jest 1258. Jest to powód do dumy i wielkiej troski o młode pokolenia od których w przyszłości zależeć będzie przyszłość naszej parafii i kościoła.

W dalszym ciągu dziękuję tym wszystkim, którzy w tym tygodniu złożyli kolejne donacje na budowę specjalnego zadania przed głównym wejściem do świątyni. Na dzień dzisiejszy donacje złożyło **71 dobroczyńców (25,317 \$)**.

Życie św. Teresy, najmłodszej osoby w gronie doktorów Kościoła.

Rodzice św. Teresy (Ludwik i Zelia), ogłoszeni błogosławionymi przez Benedykta XVI, zanim się pobrali, myśleli o wstąpieniu do zakonu. Drogę życia zakonnego wybrało ich pięć córek. Dziewiątą i ostatnią w tej rodzinie była św. Teresa. Już jako kilkuletnia dziewczynka pragnęła całkowicie poświęcić się Bogu, żyć miłością dla Niego i ludzi, modląc się o ich zbawienie.

Na kolana przed papieżem Pragnienie służenia Bogu w zakonie było tak wielkie, że każdy dzień poza nim był umieraniem z miłości. Mając lat czternaście, wraz ze swoim ojcem i siostrą udała się do Rzymu. Tam podczas audiencji u Leona XIII padła mu do nóg, prosząc usilnie, aby mogła wstąpić do zakonu karmelitańskiego, nie mając przewidzianych prawem kanonicznym szesnastu lat. Jej prośby były tak żarliwe, że musiała interweniować papieska gwardia. Pragnienie jej serca spełniło się i 9 kwietnia 1888 r. została postulantką w Karmelu. Tam spędziła niecałe dziesięć lat życia.

Mała droga „Chcę znaleźć sposób dostania się do nieba, jakąś małą drogę, bardzo prostą i bardzo krótką” – to szczere wyznanie oblubienicy, a właściwie dziecka Bożego. Tą „małą drogą” była miłość, dzięki której Teresa stała się wszystkim dla wszystkich. Modliła się za kapłanów i misjonarzy, pragnęła, aby nie została potępiona ani jedna dusza. Po prostu żyła Miłością, która ma na imię Jezus. Wzruszające są jej przemyślenia po lekturze „Hymnu o miłości” (1 Kor 13), wypowiedziane z dziecięcą radością i ufnością: „Moim powołaniem jest miłość... W sercu Kościoła, mojej Matki, ja będę miłością”. Droga powołania św. Teresy okazała się nie tylko mała, ale i krótka. Jej ostatnie lata życia to ogromne cierpienie spowodowane nieuleczalną gruźlicą. Miłość pozwoliła jej znieść także ten krzyż w sposób radosny. Przeszła na drugą stronę życia ze słowami: „Mój Boże! Kocham Cię!”.
