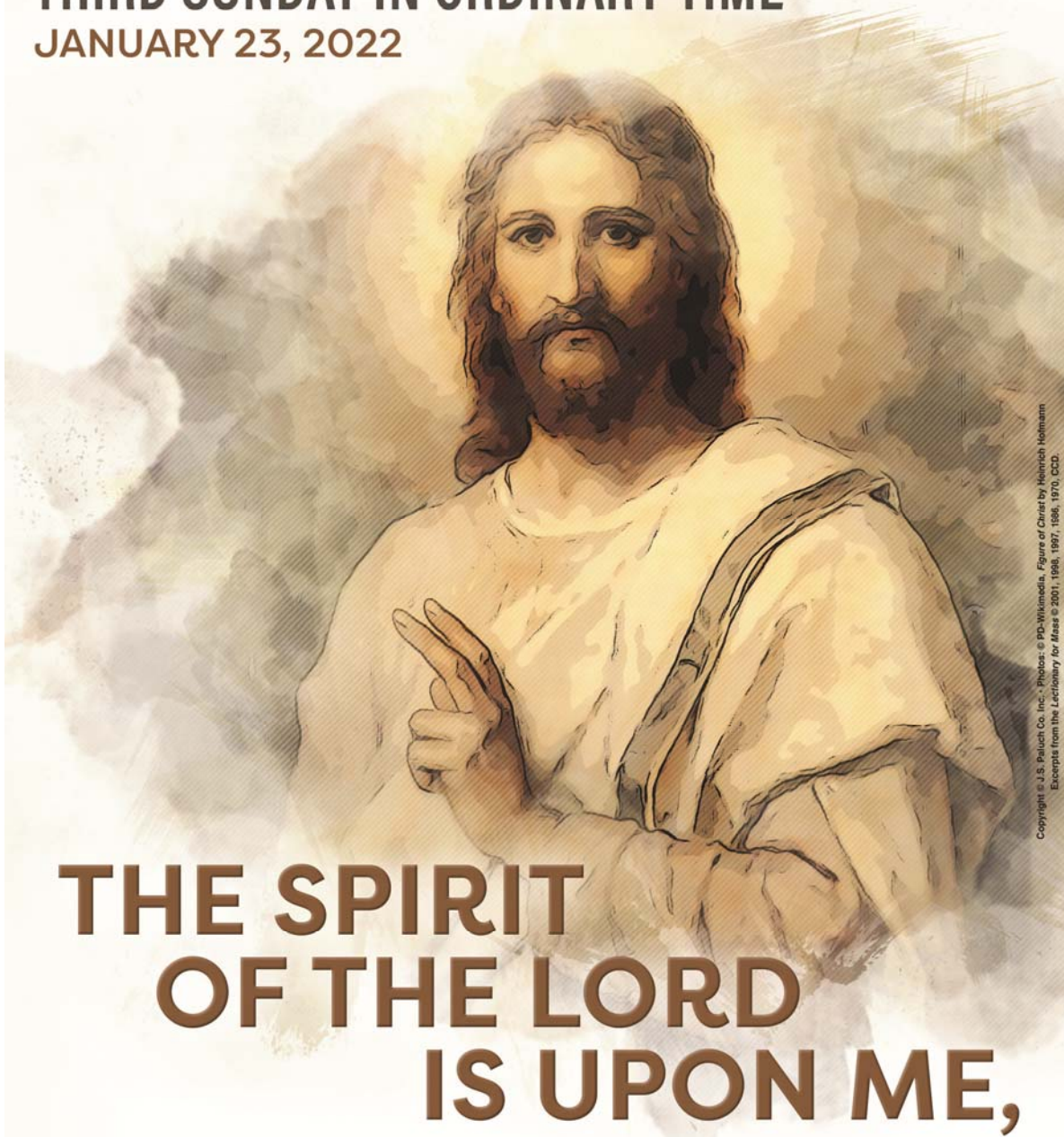

GOD'S LAW

Scripture has always held God's law to be the path to human happiness. In today's first reading, Ezra the priest reads the scroll of the law to the people returned from exile. They weep—then are joyful. Israel's relationship with God had always been defined by how they kept and lived God's law. The author of Psalm 96 likewise praises the law of God as the source of wisdom, joy and enlightenment, purity and justice.

In his advice to the bickering Corinthians, Paul points out that, just as God has made all parts of a human body essential for the health of the whole, living as "Christ's body" requires that each member be recognized as necessary for the good of all. Finally, in Luke's Gospel Jesus claims that the Spirit is sending him to relieve human suffering. Like Ezra, he is reading from a scroll, proclaiming God's "law" of mercy to those in need.

Z liurka Ks. Proboszcza

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście !

Diogenes z Synopy, grecki filozof, chodził kiedyś po mieście w biały dzień ze świecą w rękę i świecił ludziom w oczy. „Co robisz?” pytali go. Odpowiadał im: „Szukam człowieka! Szukam ludzi z sercem! Szukam ludzi, którzy używają darów Ducha Świętego”.

Dziwny jest nasz współczesny świat. Za ścianą ktoś umiera. Znajdują go po tygodniu. Tłumy ludzi w sklepach, ale każdy jakiś samotny i smutny. Twarze bez wyrazu. Ciała bez ducha. Ludzie i nie ludzie... Jakby zamknięci od środka. Dziś częściej niż kiedykolwiek spotykamy ludzi bez serca! Spotykamy niestety ludzi z kamiennym sercem! Najgorsze jest to, że widząc to wszystko poprostu milczymy i niereagujemy! Milczenie na taką sytuację jest przyzwoleniem na działanie złego ducha! Naszym moralnym obowiązkiem jest walczyć z istniejącym złem we współczesnym świecie. Proszę was nie milczcie jak skały!

Tertulian starożytny myśliciel mówił: „**Nie rodźmy się, lecz stajemy się chrześcijanami!**”. Stajesz się człowiekiem! Stajesz się każdego dnia uczniem Jezusa i Jego apostołem! Pamiętaj, że Bóg szuka w tobie człowieka! Jeśli chcesz być człowiekiem – patrz na Jezusa. Jeśli jest ci ciężko – patrz na Jezusa. Jeśli denerwują cię ludzie i ich złe postępowanie – patrz na Jezusa. Tylko Jezus wie jak to jest stać się człowiekiem. Jego człowieczeństwo jest dla nas wzorem. Zawsze i wszędzie bądź z Jezusem, bądź w Jezusie i bądź dla Jezusa oraz bliźnich w dzisiejszym świecie. Człowieczeństwo widać lepiej w świetle Jezusa oraz w Jego Kościele.

NIEODWRACALNA MIŁOŚĆ

Nawet jeżeli człowiek ucieka od Boga, to Bóg nigdy nie ucieka od człowieka. W rytmie tego zwykłego czasu jesteśmy zaproszeni, by wzrastać w miłości, spełniając nasze codzienne obowiązki.

Czytania tej niedzieli mają wspólny temat, który je łączy: są nim zaślubiny. Każdy z nas ma doświadczenie obecności na czymś ślubie, może swoim, może znajomego. W trakcie zaślubin dwie osoby przysięgają wobec Boga i wspólnoty wieczną miłość, która ma je połączyć na zawsze. Ten obraz zaślubin i wzajemnej miłości ma głębokie zakorzenienie w Biblii, tak w Starym jak i w Nowym Testamencie. Prorocy Izajasz i Jeremiasz często mówią o mistycznych zaślubinach między Bogiem i Izraelem: „spodobałaś się Panu i twoja kraina otrzyma męża” (pierwsze czytanie). Ta nieodwracalna miłość Boga do człowieka jest przypomniana przez proroków szczególnie wtedy, gdy lud okazuje niewierność. Można powiedzieć, że żadna porażka ludu wyrażająca się jego niewiernością, która ma bardzo bolesne i konkretne konsekwencje, nie prowadzi jednak do zerwania przez Boga przymierza zawartego z Izraelem: „Nie będą więcej mówić o tobie «Porzucona» (...). Raczej cię nazwą «Moje w niej upodobanie», a krainę twoją – «Poślubiona»” (pierwsze czytanie). Dlatego też nieprzypadkowo ewangelista Jan pisze o znakach Jezusa, zaczynając od wesela w Kanie Galilejskiej. Nieodwracalna miłość Boga do człowieka, przepowiedana przez proroków, stała się jeszcze silniejsza, bo Bóg stał się człowiekiem! To jest dobra nowina, która zmienia los człowieka. To jest czas na radość i zamiana wody w wino, o której dziś słyszymy, ma właśnie to podkreślić. Czy jednak w moim życiu Pan Bóg znajdzie miejsce, dzięki któremu będzie mógł rozlewać swoją miłość? o.
