BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

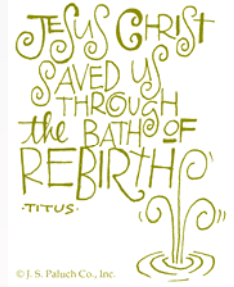

JOHN THE BAPTIST: PATRON SAINT OF LITURGICAL MINISTERS?

John the Baptist was what we might call today a "social influencer." People paid attention to what he had to say. And what he said affected the choices people made. Yet today's Gospel reminds us of John the Baptist's ultimate goal: "One mightier than I is coming." The Baptizer walks the fine line between drawing attention to himself with his fiery preaching and then re-directing that attention to Jesus, the "beloved Son." John the Baptist could be considered the "patron saint" of those who minister as lectors, extraordinary ministers of the eucharist, cantors, greeters, acolytes, and musicians. Isn't John's teaching a good goal for a liturgical (or any!) minister? Rooted in the graces of their own baptism, ministers must be skilled and confident enough to draw people's attention (or, at least, not turn them off!) and then gradually re-focus that attention on Jesus. It is a dynamic and awesome responsibility.

It was on the Fourth Sunday of Advent this past December that we first heard of the two cousins, John and Jesus, meeting. Then it was in the womb of their mothers, Elizabeth and Mary. Now the cousins meet again on the shore of the Jordan River. John is already well known—so much so that people had begun to wonder if he was the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus, on the other hand, is about to begin his ministry. One could say that Jesus entered the waters of the Jordan as a private person and came out of them as a public one. The voice from heaven left no doubt about that. As we come to the end of the Christmas season our readings echo Isaiah and Titus (see Advent and Christmas Day readings) and together with today's Psalm 104 they point us to Pentecost. We are on the cusp of a new creation.

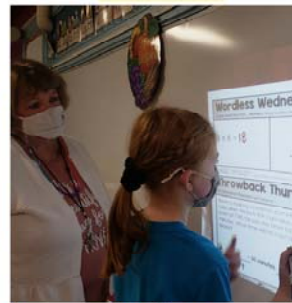

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście !

*W Nowym Roku 2022 życzę Wam:
12 miesięcy zdrowia,
53 tygodni szczęścia,
8760 godzin wytrwałości,
525600 minut pogody ducha,
31536000 sekund miłości.*



Pamiętajcie, że to nie Nowy Rok ma być dobry. To człowiek ma być dobry! Zachęcam i zapraszam wszystkich do modlitwy w naszym kościele. Dlaczego? Bo modlić się, to pójść na spacer z Bogiem, po to, by uzgodnić wspólne marzenia na Nowy Rok Pański 2022!

**„Jezu, ufam Tobie”!

W pierwszą niedzielę po uroczystości Objawienia Pańskiego (Trzech Króli) wspominamy chrzest Chrystusa w Jordanie. W czasie swojego chrztu objawił się On Izraelitom jako prawdziwy Mesjasz namaszczonego Duchem Świętym. Tu rozpoczął Jezus - objawiwszy swoje posłannictwo - swą działalność publiczną. Święto Chrztu Pańskiego kończy okres świąteczny Bożego Narodzenia. Ten epizod z życia Jezusa musi być wielkiej wagi skoro Kościół wyróżnił go osobnym świętem. Dlaczego? Ponieważ od tego uroczystego aktu Zbawiciel rozpoczął swoją misję nauczycielską. Miał wtedy około trzydziestu lat, gdyż dopiero od tego wieku zwyczaj żydowski pozwalał występować publicznie przed ludem i nauczać. Misja Chrystusa została potwierdzona z nieba. Bóg Ojciec, dał Mu świadectwo, że jest On Synem Bożym i ma prawo przemawiać w imieniu Boga. Sam Bóg Syna swojego z tą misją wysłał. Uwydatnia się też objawienie się Trójcy Świętej: Bóg Ojciec przemawia. Syn Boży jest w postaci ludzkiej, a Duch Święty pojawia się nad Nim w postaci gołębicy (epifania trynitarna). Skąd jednak wiadomo, iż to gołębica symbolizowała Ducha Świętego? Fakt ten wyjaśnia nam św. Jan Apostoł w swojej Ewangelii: „Jan dał takie świadectwo: Ujrzałem Ducha, który jak gołębica zstępował z nieba i spoczął na Nim. Ja Go przedtem nie znałem, ale Ten, który mnie posłał, abym chrzczył wodą, powiedział do mnie: Ten, nad którym ujrzysz Ducha zstępującego i spoczywającego nad Nim, jest Tym, który chrzci Duchem Świętym.



Ja to ujrzałem i daję świadectwo, że On jest Synem Bożym” (J 1, 32-34). Święto zostało wprowadzone przez papieża Piusa XII w 1955 r. pod nazwą wspomnienie Chrztu Pana Jezusa, na 13 stycznia (ostatni dzień oktawy). Reforma Soboru Watykańskiego II (1969) - przeniosła je na niedzielę po Objawieniu Pańskim. Jednakże nigdy chyba w pełni nie będziemy mogli pojąć znaczenia i sensu sakramentu chrztu św. Przez jego przyjęcie staliśmy się dziećmi Bożymi. Tak jak w czasie Chrztu Jezusa w Jordanie Bóg Ojciec niejako „zadeklarował”: „Ty jesteś moim dzieckiem umiłowanym, w tobie mam upodobanie” i od tego momentu zmieniła się diametralnie optyka naszego życia. Jako dzieci Boże nie jesteśmy już w niewoli zła i grzechu pierworodnego. Zostaliśmy włączeni w rodzinę Kościoła, rodzinę Bożą i staliśmy się pełnoprawnymi członkami domu Bożego. Niedziela Chrztu Pańskiego przypomina nam i nakłania do ponownego przemyślenia faktu naszego chrztu i wszystkich z niego wypływających konsekwencji i zobowiązań.
